SUBJECT: Upcoming Sustainability Resource Session: Mining and Public

Trust: Bridging the Perception Gap

The National Mining Association (NMA) has scheduled a Sustainability Resource session titled "Mining and Public Trust: Bridging the Perception Gap", scheduled for Thursday, July 31, from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM Eastern.

In this session, TDi's Assheton Carter will host a fireside chat with:

- **Jonathan Vanherberghen**, Director of External Affairs Europe at Rio Tinto, and
- **Dr. Peter Tom Jones**, Director of KU Leuven's Institute for Sustainable Metals and Minerals (SIM²).

Jonathan Vanherberghen brings firsthand perspective from one of Europe's most strategically significant—but publicly contested—lithium ventures: Rio Tinto's Jadar Project in Serbia. Although endorsed by the European Commission as vital to Europe's energy future, the project has encountered strong opposition, underscoring the deep trust gap between mining companies and civil society.

As featured in Dr. Jones' documentary <u>Not in My Country</u>, the discussion will offer an in-depth analysis of the Jadar Project and explore why scientific

evidence alone often fails to build public trust. The panel will examine the role of emotions, values, misinformation, and media narratives in shaping public opinion, and how the mining sector can better engage to build credibility with both local communities and broader society.

Dr. Jones leads a research hub of over 400 experts dedicated to the exploration, extraction, refining, and recycling of energy-transition metals vital to clean energy and mobility. With more than 30 years of experience, he has contributed to nearly 40 European projects on critical metals and authored several books and documentaries addressing climate and environmental challenges.

Join us for a thought-provoking session designed to spark insight and foster meaningful dialogue on the evolving relationship between mining and public trust.
