MSHA Proposes 18 Deregulatory Rules

In alignment with the Trump administration's deregulatory and energy policy initiatives, the Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) has proposed to withdraw or revise 18 regulations. These changes-some long requested by industry-are now being addressed through formal rulemaking. The proposed revisions aim to:

- Update or eliminate outdated technologies
- Reduce regulatory burdens on mine operators
- Curtail excessive authority of district managers
